## Fiftieth Anniversary of Free Church

March 17, 2001, will mark the fiftieth anniversary of the commencement of the witness of the Free Presbyterian Church of Ulster, and Let the Bible Speak is planning to mark the occasion by producing a new video documentary titled "These Fifty Years." We hope to capture on video the personalities, vision, conflicts, and victories of the church over the last half-century. During that time the work has developed from a struggling and very localized witness into a denomination with branches in many parts of the world. The LTBS video will seek to highlight the international work of the church that was born in Crossgar amid



It will not be inexpensive and we appeal to all Free Presbyterians to pray for its success and to help in every practical way possible. Scheduling public showings of the documentary in local churches and purchasing copies of the video are two sure ways of helping finance the project—and, of course, any special donations toward the costs we are incurring will be very welcome!

## Good Books Available

In our last issue we carried news of our editor's new book, *The Chariots of God: The Law in Relation to the Cross and the Christian*. The book is a careful, consistent, and eminently Christ-centred examination of the relation of the law to the gospel and to believers. It avoids the extremes of legalism and

His new book, *Complete in Him: A Guide to Understanding and Enjoying the Gospel*, promises to be just as helpful. It is a study of the major themes of the gospel.

### Response to *LTBS Quarterly*


